This 3-year project provides support for higher education institutions and universities in Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo*, Montenegro, North Macedonia and Serbia, that are interested in modernizing their teacher education modules.

Following the important steps already taken by Western Balkan countries to modernize school curricula, a key endeavor is to develop and pilot new and innovative teacher education modules, emphasizing practice-oriented teaching promoting citizenship, democracy and human rights.

Through regional network meetings, trainings and study visits, the project offers a platform for cooperation and exchange among universities, higher education institutions and other actors involved in teacher training.
